This role requires a strong understanding of lighting technology, design principles, and collaboration with the creative team to bring each performance to life.

## **Key Responsibilities:**

- Make adjustments based on director feedback or technical requirements.
- Provide support during performances to troubleshoot any lighting issues that may arise.

#### 4. Collaboration & Communication:

- Work closely with the Stage Manager, Technical Director, Set Designer, and other departments to ensure seamless integration of lighting with other production elements.
- Communicate clearly with the crew regarding setup, changes, and expectations.
- Ensure that lighting contributes to mood, focus, and storytelling in each scene.

## 5. Safety & Equipment Management:

- Ensure all lighting instruments are safely installed and operated according to industry standards.
- Manage inventory and maintenance of lighting equipment and accessories.
- Troubleshoot technical issues related to lighting hardware or control systems.

- Experience integrating lighting with sound and video elements using synchronized control software.
